DeKalb County's local **Illinois workNet Center**, in conjunction with Kishwaukee College, provides a number of job seeker and employer services.

Job seeker services include computer access, job search assistance, on-site job placement, and financial aid for training.

Employer services include assistance with finding qualified candidates, pre-employment assessments, customized training, and on-the-job training programs that provide hands-on training with up to 50% reimbursement to employers for as long as six months of the wages.
