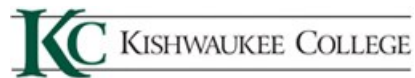

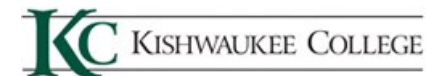

- Individualized design and implementation of specific hands-on training.
- WIOA funding provides 50% wage reimbursement for up to the first 6 months of employment for eligible hires.
